Application to correct non-registration or mistaken registration

Notice is hereby given that an application has been made by Alan Joseph Routledge and Janice Routledge to Cumbria County Council as Commons Registration Authority, concerning land at Lakeside Cottage (formerly known as Malanridge and Lakeridge Cottage), Lakerigg, Dalston described more fully below.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows: the land was provisionally registered as common land on 5th September 1969 under section 4 of Commons Registration Act 1965 pursuant to the Application no. 1130 submitted by Dalston Parish Council. The land was either covered by the building or was within the curtilage of a building on 5th September 1969. That building was Lakeside Cottage (then known as Lakerigg Cottage). The provisional registration became final on 5th September 1972. Since 5th September 1969 the land has at all times been and still is covered by a building or is within the curtilage of a building. The applicants have requested to remove Lakeside Cottage (being all land registered under the title CU167944) from CL205.

If the application is granted, in whole or in part, the registration authority will give effect to the determination by preparing fresh edition of the register map showing the amended boundary of CL205.


