Minutes from the previous meeting – Minutes Agreed

Town Deal Projects – Overview presented by PG

JL: Would be useful to understand the return on investment numbers, understanding how it is going to be presented, low level of match funding, deliverability testing of the project.

PG: Total estimated £427m total gross GVA across the region, outputs and outcomes will need to be turned into economic value for money. As far as we know we don't have any requirements to identify return on investment. At this stage of the town deal project we have identified what they are looking for.

NH: Peter is right that the guidance doesn't ask for it, however if you have it you should include it. Coming into the heads of terms we want to be sure that the return on investment is going to be there. If there are known risks, it would be wise to highlight those. Need to make sure that the Town investment plan is explicit about everything and not assume that whoever is assessing is going to know about Carlisle.

PG: We are confident the level of new jobs created when converted into gross GVA will turn into very good value of investment even before we start adding all the other benefits.

Town Investment Plan – Presented by PG – Changes on previous document

DJ: can't see any reference to the two World Heritage sites on our door step in the foreword or context?

EP: Good point, that fits easily into the foreword. I think it says 'outstanding natural beauty' but World Heritage is better.

DJ: Referred quite a lot of investment plan about the city centre but expressed concern that the TIP projects don't focus enough on improving the city centre.

SR: The majority of the projects are within the city centre boundaries and does impact on the city centre

DJ: Concerned that the public realm in the city is tired and the town investment plan won't address this

EP: Understand where this point, but hopefully the FHSF will address most of it.

JeM: Need to look at investments in a holistic way and look at the different elements and the various projects as a whole and the projects that come together which will support the strategy. Market Square project will see investment in public realm in the city centre and is part of the FHSF bid.

HF: Riverside will be happy to include a line to support the document on the investments they are undertaking which may add value to the TIP projects and support the narrative/strategy.

PG: Will follow up with Hannah directly.

AM: I like it. Narrative is much improved. The story (need) builds nicely and is well argued.

EP: Are we comfortable with the phrasing of Carlisle's role within Cumbria as the 'capital'?

AH: Understand the reasoning and rational but need to consider views from other areas across the County and Borderlands, and if this makes sense elsewhere, to other authorities/areas.

JeM: 'capital' phrase is about acknowledging the role of the city as the only city and biggest area by population which makes Carlisle unique.

EP: Important to appreciate every areas unique role- for example West Cumbria is the county's industrial powerhouse and Carlisle is the capital and the regional centre.

AH: St Cuthberts Garden Village and Kingmoor Park Enterprise Zone needed positioned in the document more strongly.

NH: Word Count of 10,000 on TIP, will be enforced for Cohorts 2 and 3, conscious that a few annex are included which will be read but may not be read in as much detail, if there is anything vitally important it needs to go in the TIP main body.

SR: we are working to get the word count within the 10,000.

JL: Alignment with government priorities, is there any specific reason we don't mention levelling up?

EP: Levelling up referenced within document, but it would also be good to bring this into the introduction and foreword so that it is clear and highlighted in the document.
