

I have previously commented on the main modifications for policy HO11 Gypsy Travellers and attended the Inspection meeting 19<sup>th</sup> Jan 2016 for further details please refer to AWAZ Cumbria correspondence with the Council on the subject matter: Carlisle District Local Plan Examination Matter 4.

AWAZ Cumbria actively engage with the members of Gypsy and Travellers communities in Carlisle and support a range of community development inititives as well as provide public policy advocacy support on the issues affecting black and ethnic minority communities across the county.

AWAZ Cumbria has been in communication with the Council on this subject matter since 11 May 2015 when we enquired from the Council via e-mail:

"Good afternoon. Would it be possible for you to advise or signpost me to the relevant officer in the Council who can help with the information about the Council plan to develop traveller provision (Permanent and temporary pitches) as per the needs of the community during 201516 or onward. Do we have enough spaces available to meet the needs of Carlisle G&T community on the existing site provisions?

What is the Council allocation or letting policy for G&T Community on Council owned/allocated G&T site provisions?

In response to the AWAZ e-mail the Council's responsible officer replied that "In brief current permanent provision in the district is 75 pitches, plus 30 transit. The 2013 countywide GTAA identified the need for 15 additional permanent pitches in the District over a 15 year period; six of which have already been delivered. The Local Plan makes provision for the remaining nine permanent pitches.

The 2013 GTAA identified need for up to 50 pitches across the county; (up to 8 transit pitches in the district) based on the incidence of unauthorised encampments between 2010/13. The Council's 15 pitch permanent site at Low Harker Dene is managed by Home Space. There is a needs based allocation policy.

Following this response AWAZ has facilitated a meeting of the representatives of the Gypsy and Travellers Community and the Council on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2015. The members of the G&T community shared their concerns with the Council regarding the erroneous methodological basis of 2013 GTAA and the lack of engagement with the community.

Over a dozen members of the community in the meeting informed the Council that they were present in Carlisle at the time of the survey conducted to inform 2013 GTAA. Majority of them are current or former residents of Council's authorised permanent and temporary G&T sites in Carlisle.

They do not recall anyone contacted them to participate in the survey. For further details please note the failure of the 2013 GTAA to survey the many families living on the transit area at Hadrians Camp (as recorded on page 131 GTAA point D.18).

Furthermore, in their view "the 2013 GTAA is not worth the piece of paper it is written on" as it is by and large based on creative accounting of participants numbers and does not meet the standards of the valid qualitative data sampling principles. The community challenges the accuracy of the data and does not believe that this 2013 GTAA truly reflects the needs of the community based on adequatel input from the members of the community. The survey was conducted by any organisation that has serious conflict of interest with regards to the outcome of the report. Around the time of research the same organisation has been failing on HCA's Affordable Homes Programme to develop/deliver pitches in Cumbria. Most of the Districts across

Cumbria failed to identify appropriate land/sites within the HCA's timescale to spend the grant. It is a widely held perception within G&T community that the Home Space Sustainable Accommodation CIC has engineered the data to show there is less demand and need to provide pitches for G&T community to create an excuse for most of the Districts to cover up their failings in identifying land/site in their local development plans.

The authors of the 2013 GTAA report have failed to carry out appropriate checks with regards to the conflict of interest of their survey agent HSSA CIC. Furthermore, they were unable to demonstrate the validity of the respondents' data with regards to the diversity profile of the respondent's e.g. age profile and their geographical location post code map.

Since the publication of the Carlisle District Local Plan Schedule of main modification in March 2016 over 25 members of the Gypsy and Travellers community have contacted AWAZ Cumbria through their local community group and ask to make this representation.

The members of the Gypsy and Travellers community in Carlisle and those who have current or prospective family relations in Carlisle do not consider that the main modifications proposed address all the concerns raised and discussed at various meetings and communications with the Council.

In their view the proposed Policy HO11 does not address all the concerns raised at various meetings including the EIP on 19<sup>th</sup> Jan 2016.

The members of the community has serious concerns that no modifications are proposed or considered necessary to the level of permanent pitches planned for nor were any additional sites identified as being required in response to the levels of need set out in the Plan.

The 2013 GTAA recommended level of need is based on erroneous methodological assumptions and reliance on turnover. Furthermore, the Council has failed to factor in the number of unauthorised encampments during the last 3 years. A snapshot of the reported unauthorized encampments during August 2014 – Dec 2015 in Carlisle District is attached. The number of caravans in these unauthorised encampment incidents during this short period of time clearly demonstrate that the use of flawed 2013 GTAA by the Council as the only evidence in its proposed Carlisle District Local Plan Schedule of main modification recommendation would adversely impact on the life chances of the Gypsy and Travellers community.

The members of the G&T Community have serious concerns with regard to the lack of choice and provision for any provisions for the development of small private G&T sites to address the need.

The proposed concentrations of new pitches at Lower Harker site seriously concern the community. This site lack public transport links and is in very close proximity of an electrical sub-station which could be hazardous for the health and wellbeing of many people living on this site with specific medical conditions. Furthermore, AWAZ Cumbria has serious concerns that the Council has not demonstrated due regard to meet the three aims of the public sector equality duty under Equality Act 2010, particularly race equality outcomes by mitigating adverse impact on Gypsy and Travellers community with regards to the proposed Carlisle District Local Plan 2015-2030 Schedule of main modifications.

Therefore, we suggest that the Council should take 'Positive Action' and allow flexible provision within the Carlisle District Local Plan 2015-2030 Schedule of main modifications to allay genuine concerns of the Gypsy and Travellers community and proactively engage with the community to identify their needs and allocate appropriate site provision that is reflective of the diversity of needs and choice.

Q5. The Carlisle District Local Plan 2015-30 should make clear that there are concerns with the assumptions made in the GTAA and that until this is revisited and monitoring can prove what level of turnover actually occurs and how many pitches this has potential to yield, there is uncertainty over the scale of immediate need.

The needs of the families living on what is supposed to be the transit area at Hadrians Camp needs to be taken into consideration

Provision should be made for more private sites in accordance with the findings in the GTAA.

The Council should consider the number of unauthorised encampments in assessing the needs.

Q6. Do you have any comments on the supporting documents, such as the Sustainability Appraisal Addendum or the Habitats Regulations Assessment Addendum?

The Gypsy and Travellers community has concerns that they haven't been made aware of the existence of the Health Impact Assessment of Lower Harker site. AWAZ Cumbria would like to have a copy of the HIA for the current G&T site at Lower Harker and for the prosposed development.
