

CUMBERLAND COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, MARYPORT AND SURROUNDING AREA)
(CONSOLIDATION AND PROVISION OF TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) ORDER 2026

1. Cumberland Council hereby give notice that on 3rd March 2026 it made the above Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (4), 19, 32, 35, 35A, 38, 45, 46, 47, 49, 51, 53 and 64 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
2. The Order shall come into operation on 17th March 2026 and its effect will be to consolidate the provisions of the Cumberland Council (Various Roads, Maryport and Surrounding Area) (Consolidation and Provision of Traffic Regulations) Order 2024; AND
 - (a) Introduce/amend (as applicable) “No Waiting At Any Time” (double yellow line) restrictions on parts of the following: -
 - (i) Lonsdale View, Browside Road, Maryport Road and Central Road, Dearham;
 - (ii) Lawson Street, Fleming Square and Centenary Close, Maryport;
 - (iii) North Quay, Strand Street, King Street and Nelson Street, Maryport (see also paragraph 2(b));
 - (iv) Glasson Industrial Estate; and
 - (v) Lowther Street, Flimby
 - (b) Introduce “Disabled Parking, Monday to Saturday inclusive, 8.30 am – 6.00pm, maximum stay 3 hours, no return within 3 hours” on parts of North Quay, Strand Street, King Street and Nelson Street, Maryport;
 - (c) Introduce 3 hour waiting limit, no return within 3 hours to the existing disabled parking, Monday to Saturday inclusive, 8.30 am – 6.00 pm restriction on Senhouse Street, and Lowther Senhouse Street, Maryport;

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made there under has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within six weeks of 3rd March 2026 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
